Whilst most plastic bottles can be recycled in our kerbside collections, the pumps and trigger sprays cannot. However, please do not put these in your black sacks. We are currently planning for the return of a more normal pattern of worship and other activities. Very understandably and unavoidably, some people's circumstances have changed significantly during the past 15 months and therefore they are no longer in a position to continue duties that they were doing prior to the pandemic - or, in some cases, people have been undertaking roles for a very long time and, also understandably, would like to do something different!

We currently have a shortage of sidespeople for both the 8am and 9.30am Sunday Mass. Sidespeople are essential in ensuring the smooth running of services and the quality of welcome offered, especially to newcomers. At the moment we will only be able to run the 8am Mass once a month unless more sidespeople come forward, and 9.30am will also be difficult to run smoothly. There is also a need for more adults to help with or lead our Adventurers groups for children during the 9.30am Mass. This is predominantly with primaryaged children, though prior to the pandemic we had been discussing a monthly group for those of secondary school age - though again, we would need adult help to be able to do this.

We also need some more volunteers to serve coffee on Friday mornings and after the 9.30 Mass on Sundays. Please contact Joan Prudden (01708 223744) if you can help with this.

Since the above roles are people-facing, they require a level of safeguarding clearance, but it is not onerous. The only role requiring a DBS check is that of helping with Adventurers.
